Award for Emerging Community Based Researcher



CBRCanada recognizes excellence in community-driven research

AWARD DESCRIPTION

The Award for Emerging Community-Based Researcher recognizes and celebrates an individual who embodies community-based research values in their work. Nominees for this award should be working closely with a community(ies) in support of transformational community-driven, participatory, and action-oriented research that imagines and builds innovative solutions to pressing societal issues. Nominees demonstrate excellence in community-based research with special attention to research process (e.g., driven by community with meaningful participation of stakeholders); research quality (e.g., meaningful, useful data collection and analysis), and research impact (e.g., community issues addressed by research). The CBRCanada Award is intended to recognize the achievements of this promising community-based researcher and signify the importance of community-based research as a growing field of practice.

The Awarded Emerging Community-Based Researcher will receive a commemorative plaque and a \$1,000 cash prize to support their community-based research. Award winners will be announced in the CBRCanada e-newsletter, website, and on social media. Winners will also be invited to write a feature story to be included in our newsletter, distributed to over 50 members nationally, as well as invited to showcase their research through CBRCanada events. The winner of this award will be recognized for their research achievements at the Award Gala Celebration that will be held in person at C2UExpo 2023.



SELECTION CRITERIA

The award recipient should:

- Be an emerging community-based researcher (established within the last five years), including community researchers, PhD students or recent graduates, post-doctoral fellows, or early career researchers. Applicants should be applying no more than five years from graduation and/or five years into their current position.
- Have their research grounded in societal justice and driven by community-needs
- Be able to showcase evidence of their commitment to community-based research excellence (i.e. research process, quality and impact)
- Have conducted research with communities in Canada
- Be employed/studying at a CBRCanada member institution OR registered individual member

NOMINATION PACKAGE

Nomination packages should include:

A) A one-pager (in plain language) or video (max 5-8 minutes), including the following:

- The name and affiliation of the person(s) filling out the application and their relationship to the nominee
- The nominee's name, affiliation and contact information (email, phone number and address)
- Description of the nominee's contributions to community-based research in response to the selection criteria

B) An endorsement by members of the community (e.g., via a letter of support or video). Please include one to three community endorsements.

Submit nomination packages to: CBRCanada Secretariat, at info@communityresearchcanada.ca with the subject: "Award for Excellence in Community-Campus Research Partnership 2023".

Nominations are due April 3, 2023 at midnight ET. Award recipients will be announced late April 2023, and a Gala Ceremony will be held in-person on June 7th in Thunder Bay at C2UExpo 2023 to honour the Award Recipients. Nominations will be evaluated by the CBRCanada Awards Subcommittee.
