

Context of refugee health in Canada

- Globally, **26.6 million people** forced to leave their countries annually
- In Canada, 19,790 government assisted refugees and 31,255 privately sponsored refugees were resettled in 2022
- Need for quality, timely access to healthcare is central to refugees' successful integration into Canadian society
- Healthcare journeys of refugees can be complicated by many factors (mental health challenges, rare diseases, unsuitable living conditions, linguistic







Who we are





Mission: to improve the health and well being of refugees through the provision of culturally and linguistically competen healthcare to facilitate successful integration into the community.




Vision: Healthy and productive new Canadians contribute to the social, cultural, and economic growth of the city of Edmonton and the province of Alberta.





The road to opening the NCHC



- Gap in services from 2016 following closure of New Canadians Clinic
- NCHC Established in August 2021 following years of advocacy
- Effort driven by the Refugee Health Coalition and involvement of wide variety of stakeholders (those with lived experience, service providers, etc.)
- First community-owned and principle-driven health centre in Edmonton exclusively focused on refugee health

Building a research program

<u>Purpose</u>: Collect, co-create, and translate knowledge generated at and for the NCHC in a way that aligns with the principles-based model

Activities:

- Research & evaluation committee
- Establishing a data access policy
- Strong engagement with all stakeholders
- Supporting & mentoring students across various programs





A principles-based evaluation



<u>Purpose</u>: to evaluate the principlesbased model of the NCHC and assess how it impacts the experiences of care for the community at the Centre

- Engages service users, staff, key informants
- Both qualitative and quantitative methods





Looking ahead

Long-term stability and growth:

- Establishing charitable status
- Expansion to an additional physical location in the city

Community-based research with the NCHC:

- Implementing the principlesbased evaluation
- Ongoing data collection, analysis, and interpretation
- Knowledge mobilization
















